

## QUESTIONS (2): Who saw you? Who did you see?

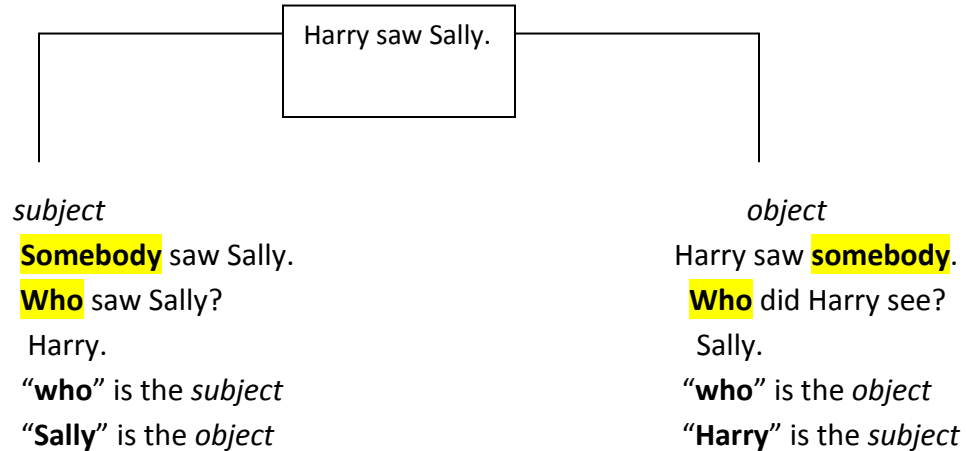
a.



Harry saw Sally.

Who **saw** Sally? Harry.

Who **did** Harry **see**? Sally



**b.** In these questions, **who** or **what** is the *subject*:

*Examples:*

→ **Who lives** in that house? (=Someone lives there – who?)

(not Who does live...?)

→ **What happened?** (=Something happened – what?)

(not What did happen.?)

→ **What's** (= **What is**) burning?

→ **Who's taken** (= **Who has taken**) my glasses?

**C.** In these questions, **who** or **what** is the *object*:

*Examples:*

→ **Who did you meet** yesterday? (= You met somebody – who?)

→ **What did she say?** (= She said something – what?)

→ **Who are you calling?**

→ **What was he wearing?**

*Compare:*

Tommy likes pizza.

→ **Who likes** pizza? Tommy.

**What does** Tommy **like?** Pizza.

Ann won some money.

→ **Who won** some money? Ann.

**What did** Ann **win?** Some money.

**d.** Use **who** for people (somebody) and **what** for things, ideas, etc. (something):

*Examples:*

→ **Who** is your favorite singer?

→ **What** is your favorite song?
